LITURGY OF The Word

First Reading

(Isaiah 53:1-5, 7-10) (Seated)

A reading from the Prophet Isaiah

Who would believe what we have heard? To whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed? The servant grew up like a sapling before him, like a shoot from the parched earth; there was in him no stately bearing to make us look at him, nor appearance that would attract us to him. He was spurned and avoided by people, a man of suffering, accustomed to infirmity, one of those from whom people hide their faces, spurned, and we held him in no esteem. Yet it was our infirmities that the servant bore, our sufferings that he endured, while we thought of him as stricken, as one smitten by God and afflicted. But he was pierced for our offenses, crushed for our sins, upon him was the chastisement that makes us whole, by his stripes we were healed. Though he was harshly treated, he submitted and opened not his mouth; like a lamb led to the slaughter or a sheep before the shearers, he was silent and opened not his mouth. Oppressed and condemned, he was taken away, and who would have thought any more of his destiny? When he was cut off from the land of the living, and smitten for the sin of his people, a grave was assigned him among the wicked and a burial place with evildoers, though he had done no wrong nor spoken any falsehood. But the LORD was pleased to crush his servant in infirmity. If he gives his life as an offering for sin, he shall see his descendants in a long life, and the will of the LORD shall be accomplished through him.

(John 14:15-21, 25-27)

And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always, the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot accept, because it neither sees nor knows it. But you know the Spirit, because it remains with you, and will be in you. I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you. In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me, because I live and you will live. On that day you will realize that I am in my Father and you are in me and I in you. Those who have my commandments and observe them are the ones who love me. And those who love me will be loved by my Father, and I will love them and reveal myself to them. "I have told you this while I am with you. The Advocate, the holy Spirit-whom the Father will send in my name-will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you. P — Almighty Father, heal us with your loving mercy. We pray that with Mary's intercessions, we may continually experience your Son's healing love. Through Christ our Lord.

Offertory (Seated)

P — (*Stand*) Pray, brethren (brothers and sisters), that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.

C — May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.

Prayer over the Offerings

P—Receive, O Lord, the offerings of our devotion, and grant that we, who celebrate your Son's work of boundless charity, may, through the example of the Blessed Virgin Mary, be confirmed in love of you and of our neighbor. Through Christ our Lord.

Grant to your Church, O Lord, that, strengthened by the power of this Sacrament, she may eagerly walk in the pathways of the Gospel, until she reaches the blessed vision of peace, which the Virgin Mary, your lowly handmaid, already enjoys eternally in glory. Through Christ our Lord.

Prayer to the Virgin of Peñafrancia
