Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Collect

P — Let us pray. (brief pause)

God, who were pleased to choose Blessed Mary as the virginal chamber where your Word would dwell, grant, we pray, that under her protection, we may participate joyfully in her commemoration. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading

(1 Chronicles 15:3-4, 15-16; 16:1-2) (Seated)

A reading from the First book of Chronicles

David assembled all Israel in Jerusalem to bring up the ark of the Lord to its place, which he had prepared for it. Then David gathered together the descendants of Aaron and the Levites. The Levites carried the ark of God on their shoulders with the poles, as Moses had commanded according to the word of the Lord. David also commanded the chiefs of the Levites to appoint their kindred as the singers to play on musical instruments, on harps and lyres and cymbals, to raise loud sounds of joy. They brought in the ark of God, and set it inside the tent that David had pitched for it; and they offered burnt offerings and offerings of well-being before God. When David had finished offering the burnt offerings and the communion offerings, he blessed the people in the name of the Lord.

Responsorial Psalm

(Psalm 40:7-8, 8-9, 10-11)

R — Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will.

Gospel

(Luke 2:15-19)

P — A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.

C — Glory to you, O Lord.

Then the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When the shepherds saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart.

P — The Gospel of the Lord.

C — Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

Homily (Seated)

Prayer of the Faithful

P — Let us always be one in faith. As a community confident in the love of our beloved Ina, we humbly present to God our petitions. In every petition we say:

R — Lord, hear our prayer.

1. For the leaders of the Church: the Pope, Bishops, and the Clergy that they may continually grow in holiness through greater commitment to the gift of the ministerial priesthood: let us pray to the Lord. (R)
2. For our government leaders, that genuine loving service would be their primary concern: let us pray to the Lord. (R)

formation and priestly life and become worthy of the gift of priesthood: let us pray to the Lord. (R)

4. For all of us, that with the love of our Ina, Our Lady of Peñafrancia, we strengthen further our oneness as a community of faith, hope, and love: let us pray to the Lord. (R)

P — Heavenly Father, enable us to always experience your loving presence through our reception of the Sacraments and our daily commitment to follow your divine will. Make us your worthy children. Through Christ our Lord.

C — Amen.

LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

Offertory (*Seated*)

P — (*Stand*) Pray, brethren (brothers and sisters), that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.

C — May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.

Prayer over the Offerings

P — May the offerings your people make in commemoration of Blessed Mary be acceptable to you, O Lord, for by her virginity she pleased you and in humility conceived your Son, our Lord. Who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

C — Amen.

P — The Lord be with you.

For by the overshadowing of the Holy Spirit she conceived your Only Begotten Son, and without losing the glory of virginity, brought forth into the world the eternal Light, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Through him the Angels praise your majesty, Dominions adore and Powers tremble before you. Heaven and the Virtues of heaven and the blessed Seraphim worship together with exultation. May our voices, we pray, join

with theirs in humble praise, as we acclaim:

All — Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Eucharistic Prayer (*Kneel*)

P — Mystery of Faith.

C — We proclaim your Death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection until you come again.

COMMUNION RITE

Lord's Prayer (*Stand*)

P — At the Savior's command...

All — Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

P — Deliver us, Lord, we pray...

C — For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and for ever.

P — Lord Jesus Christ, who said...

C — Amen

Sign of Peace

P — The peace of the Lord be with you always.

C — And with your spirit.

P — Let us offer each other the sign of peace.

Lamb of God

All — Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us. Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us. Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, grant us peace.

Invitation to Communion (*Kneel*)

P — Behold the lamb of God...

All — Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

Communion Antiphon (*Lk 2: 19*)

(*Said when there is no Communion Hymn*)

Mary treasured all these words, reflecting on them in her heart.

Prayer after Communion (*Stand*)

P — Let us pray. (*brief pause*)

Having been made partakers of this spiritual food, we pray, O Lord our God,

that, steadily imitating the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may always be found intent on service of the Church and may know the joys of doing your will. Through Christ our Lord.

B — Amen.

Prayer to the Virgin of Peñafrancia

All — Turn to me thine eyes, Oh most loving Virgin of Peñafrancia and have mercy on my soul that come to thee, full of repentance.

Protect my family, relatives, friends and benefactors. Intercede for your devotees, both the living and the dead, especially for those whom I am most obliged to help.

Pray for me, console me, save me. In my hours of peril, adversity and afflictions, above all, in the hour of my death, appear before your Divine Son to help and defend me. Tell Him that I am your devotee, that having complete trust in your protection I kneel before your miraculous image to ask for your powerful intercession.

Virgin of Peñafrancia, Pray for me, help me, console me, and deliver me from all evil. Amen.
