## LITURGY OF THE WORD

**First Reading**

(1 Corinthians 8:1b-7, 11-13) (Seated)

**A Reading from the First Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians**

After Jesus had been taken up into heaven, the apostles returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a sabbath day's journey away. When the apostles entered the city they went to the upper room where they were staying, Peter and John and James and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James son of Alphaeus, Simon the Zealot, and Judas son of James. All these devoted themselves with one accord to prayer, together with some women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers.

**L** — Word of the Lord.

**C** — Thanks be to God.

**Responsorial Psalm**

(Psalm 139:1b-3, 13-14ab, 23-24)

**R** — Glorious things are told of you, O city of God.

1. The LORD loves the city founded on holy mountains, loves the gates of Zion more than any dwelling in Jacob. (R)
2. Glorious things are said of you, O city of God! But of Zion it must be said: "They all were born right here." (R)

(John 2:1-11)

**P** — The Lord be with you.

**C** — And with your spirit.

**P** — A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.

**C** — Glory to you, O Lord.

There was a wedding in Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told the servers, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then Jesus told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from (although the servers who had drawn the water knew), the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs in Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.

**Prayer of the Faithful**

4. For all of us gathered here, that through the guidance of our Ina, Our Lady of Peñafrancia, we may all sincerely offer to God our loving sacrifices and be worthy of the graces of the Sacraments that we receive: let us pray to the Lord. (R)

**P** — Our loving Father, may the love of our Blessed Mother continue to bring us closer to your Son. Hear our prayers and grant us the purity of heart and soul. Through Christ our Lord.

### Prayer over the Offerings

**P** — We offer you the sacrifice of praise, O Lord, as we rejoice in commemorating the Mother of your Son; grant, we pray, that through this most holy exchange we may advance towards eternal redemption. Through Christ our Lord.

### Lord's Prayer (Stand)

**P** — At the Savior's command...

**All** — Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

**P** — Deliver us, Lord, we pray...

**C** — For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and for ever.

**P** — Lord Jesus Christ, who said...

**C** — Amen

### Sign of Peace

**P** — The peace of the Lord be with you always.

**C** — And with your spirit.

**P** — Let us offer each other the sign of peace.

### Lamb of God

**P** — Let us pray. (brief pause)

Renewed with this heavenly food, we humbly implore you, Lord, that, having received your Son, born of the tender Virgin, under sacramental signs, we may profess him in words and hold fast to him in deeds. Who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

**B** — Amen.

### Prayer to the Virgin of Peñafrancia

**All** — Turn to me thine eyes, Oh most loving Virgin of Peñafrancia and have mercy on my soul that come to thee, full of repentance.

Protect my family, relatives, friends and benefactors. Intercede for your devotees, both the living and the dead, especially for those whom I am most obliged to help.

Pray for me, console me, save me. In my hours of peril, adversity and afflictions, above all, in the hour of my death, appear before your Divine Son to help and defend me. Tell Him that I am your devotee, that having complete trust in your protection I kneel before your miraculous image to ask for your powerful intercession.

Virgin of Peñafrancia, Pray for me, help me, console me, and deliver me from all evil. Amen.
